Eniwa Library to Introduce No-Contact Check-Out Services, 3/24

After April 1st, the Eniwa Branch Library will implement person-less book circulation services during a part of its opening hours. Using a management system with integrated circuit (IC) tags, they hope to increase user convenience as well as their service hours. This will be the first library in Hokkaido to utilize such technology. They will test the new system every day for 30 min. after 9AM and for two hours after 5PM. The number of staff will also reduce from five to three on hand. While the library will also open 30 min. earlier, they also anticipate extending hours until 10PM in the future.

Akkeshi's "Shosho" Whiskey Wins Award in UK Competition, 3/27

At the 2022 World Whiskies Awards (WWA) it was announced that Akkeshi Shosho, produced in Kenten Jitsugyo's whiskey distillery in Akkeshi, was chosen as the world's best blended whisky. Over 1,300 brands from 268 companies appears in the WWA's 19 competition categories. Shosho was introduced in August 2021 as the fourth installment of their 24 Seasons Series and is said to have a unique balance of *peat* (smokiness) and sweetness. The chief blender at the Akkeshi distillery commented: "It's thanks to our dedicated fans and our staff's hard work that we were able to win."

JR Suspended 12,800 Times Due to Heavy Snowfall, 4/3

The JR Hokkaido Railways were suspended 12,800 times in 2021, the most in the past ten years. Railways concentrated in the Sapporo area continually suffered localized heavy snowfall and delayed snowplowing, both factors leading to several days of suspension for incoming and outgoing trains. The JR compiled an interim report pushing for an increase in winter service vehicles, but it is unclear if such a short-term solution will work. Specialists point out the need for alternative transportation. Concentrated in February, 3,525 trains and over 555,000 people had been affected within eight days of all-day suspensions, recurring another week at the end of the month.

Marching Band Parade to Be Held Once Again After 3 Years, 4/9

On June 4th, marching bands from all over Japan will march through Asahikawa in Japan's largest festival, the "Hokkaido Grand Parade of Marching Bands." While COVID-19 prevented this event from taking place for the past two years, the city will celebrate their 90th parade with a week-long citywide music event called "Asahikawa Music Week," June 4th-12th. In 2019, 88 musical groups and a total of 3,600 people participated, and they anticipate a similar number this year. A wide variety of music genres will be performed at street shows and concerts throughout the city. If you wish to participate, please call the festival's office at 0166-23-0090 (Japanese).

Yosakoi Soran to be Reduced in Size and Charged for Seating, 4/15

The festival announced their overall plans for the June event on April 14th, after three years of cancellations. As countermeasures against COVID-19, the main parade venue in Odori Park will be reduced to half its usual size and require paid seating to limit the number of attendees. Although they expect 200 teams to perform (around 70% of its original amount), no international teams will be participating. To avoid passersby from gathering, the festival will be surrounded by a curtain to prevent outside viewing. Tickets are on sale. For any questions, please call 011-23104351.



May Events in Asahikawa

AIC: Please tell us about yourself and where you are from.

Angelo: Hi! I am Angelo and I am from Brazil. I've always been interested in different cultures and wanted to travel around the world somehow. I started learning English by myself as a hobby when I was a teenager, which naturally grew into my profession, and in the last few years I felt the same spark towards the Japanese language and history.

AIC: How did you first get interested in Japan?

Angelo: Although I have fond memories of watching anime in the 90's (Saint Seiya, Sailor Moon, Evangelion, etc.), my real interest in Japan began about four years ago. I was casually listening to Japanese music at that time, so I eventually became fascinated by the sounds of the language, the writing system, its origins and –ultimately– by Japan's history and culture. One thing led to another: the more I would read about Japan, the more I loved it. So... here I am.

Hello, Asahikawa!

have you been in Japan?

Angelo: Yes, this is my first time. I've been in Japan since the end of November 2021. I lived in Sapporo for four months, where I took a life-saving intensive Japanese course at Hokkaido University as part of the program that I came here to complete. I've met some wonderful people there, including professors, fellow foreigner classmates and, of course, very friendly locals during my exploration of the city. I am happy to say that I'm having a similar experience here in Asahikawa.

AIC: What brings you to Asahikawa in particular?

Angelo: It was a combination of everything I was looking for. If I had the chance to come to Japan, I really wanted to make the most of it: knowing the country, the people, learning the language and also growing professionally by observing the Japanese educational system up close. So, I applied for the scholarship offered by the Japanese Ministry of Education (MEXT), as a teacher trainee, and I am currently enrolled at Hokkaido University of Education here in Asahikawa.

AIC: What kind of work do you do?

Angelo: I've been teaching English to high school students in Brazil for the last ten years. Although it can be challenging sometimes, I enjoy working with teenagers. That phase is such an important part of every person's life and as someone who has traveled to different parts of the world, I like to think that I might be able to inspire my students in that regard. Knowing foreign languages can bring so many opportunities and, in some cases, completely change our lives. I want them to think about how beautiful and diverse this planet is and how to explore it.

AIC: What are your hobbies?

Angelo: Without a doubt, listening to music and collecting CD's and vinyl. I am a huge fan of Yumi Matsutoya and even had the pleasure of going to one of her concerts this month in Sapporo. She is so creative and prolific. My musical taste revolves around iconic singers from the Showa period, who are still active today, including Shinji Tanimura, Anzenchitai and Koji Tamaki (legends from Asahikawa!), and my beloved divas Akina Nakamori and Miki Imai. Younger artists such as Motohiro Hata and Hikaru Utada are part of my collection, too. I also love beer.



If a person can talk about these singers while drinking beer with me, we'll be best friends immediately.

AIC: Do you have any favorite foods?

Angelo: Japan is the land of delicious food and I love basically everything here. Special mention goes to ramen (another Asahikawa specialty), okonomiyaki, yakiniku and jingisukan. And Sapporo beer is simply the best.

AIC: Are there any places you would recommend to others (restaurants, sight-seeing, etc.)?

Angelo: I love nature, so I would recommend the many beautiful parks here in Asahikawa. I often walk by the Ishikari River, one of my favorite moments of relaxation. And I'm looking forward to go to the Asahiyama Zoo this spring.

AIC: What have been your impressions of Asahikawa so far and how does it compare to your hometown?

Angelo: To me, Asahikawa offers the best of both worlds: it has many features and entertainment options of a big city while maintaining the pleasant and



cozy atmosphere of the countryside. The city is beautiful, the people are kind and the food is delicious. I live in the northeastern region of Brazil, which is very hot and sunny all year long. I really wanted to experience the complete opposite of that here in Hokkaido. Actually, I saw snow for the first time in my life here in Japan!

AIC: Do you mind sharing any frustrations or challenges you have encountered thus far?

Angelo: Definitely the language barrier. Before coming to Japan, I had been studying the language by myself for a couple of years, which gave me a solid comprehension of its structure and basic knowledge in order to survive upon arriving here. But up to that point my studies were mainly focused on reading and writing, with minimal conversation practice. Now I get the chance to develop my listening and speaking skills by talking with natives, and I'm happy to say that I have been improving a lot lately. Recently I went to the movies and I cried: not because of the movie I was watching, but because I was able to understand everything the characters were saying (laughs)! Learning Japanese is hard work and I keep studying every single day.

AIC: Do you have any goals or things you are looking forward to doing here?

Angelo: I will do my best to improve my proficiency in the language, learn from the wonderful professors at my university, make new friends and enjoy the whole experience as much as I can. I am extremely grateful for this opportunity.
