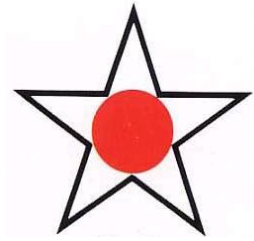

1. OVERVIEW OF ASAHIKAWA

Sep.20,1890	Three villages – Asahikawa, Kamui and Nagayama – founded in Kamikawa County.
Jul.16,1898	Kamikawa Railway Line between Takikawa and Asahikawa opened.
Oct.30,1901	The 7 th Division Headquarters of old Japanese Army was moved to Asahikawa from Sapporo.
Jan.25,1902	The lowest temperature in Japan was recorded at – 41.0°C (– 41.8°F)
Apr.1,1902	Municipal designation changed from "village" to "town".
Aug.1,1922	Municipal designation changed from "town" to "city".
Jul.15,1950	Great Hokkaido Development Exposition was held.
Jul.1,1966	Asahikawa Airport opened. Service to Tokyo started.
Jul 1, 1967	Asahiyama Zoo opened
Jun.1,1972	Heiwa Dori Shopping Street (first vehicle-free street in Japan) opened.
Sep.29,1973	National Asahikawa Medical College founded.
Mar.21,1981	The 1 st International Vasa Ski Competition in Asahikawa (approved by FIS) held.
Aug.7,1989	Temperature recorded at 36°C (96.8°F), the highest in the history of the Asahikawa.
Sep.20,1990	Asahikawa's 100 th Anniversary Ceremony held.
Apr.1, 2000	Asahikawa approved as a core city.
Jul.18, 2003	Hokkaido International Airline (Air Do) "Asahikawa – Haneda flight" put into service.
Jun.8, 2006	The first regular international flights at the Asahikawa Airport started (between Asahikawa and Seoul, Korea.)
Mar.27, 2007	The Asahiyama Zoo surpassed the 3,000,000 visitor per 2006 fiscal year for the first time.
Aug.1, 2007	Commencement of household garbage collection charges start.
Oct. 1, 2008	General Disaster Control Center's main facility becomes operational.
Sep. 1, 2009	Kagura Nursery Complex – Iki Iki Center Kagura opened.
June 29, 2010	CoCoDe – Asahikawa Community Support Center opened.
Oct.9-11, 2010	Holding of "Furusato - Bounty of the North Food Festival" as part of the 120th Anniversary of the Founding of Asahikawa events.
Dec.10, 2010	Enactment and Enforcement of Asahikawa City Council Basic Ordinances.
April 1, 2011	Eiryobashidori extended through Hyoten Bridge and Kitasaito Bridge.
June 24, 2011	Feeeal Asahikawa opens at the former Marui-Imai Asahikawa Store site.
Nov.23, 2011	Opening of the new JR Asahikawa Station building.
Sep.3, 2012	Opening of Asahikawa City Animal Welfare Center, "Animaaru."
Apr.18, 2013	Signing of a pact to promote friendship exchange by City Councils of Asahikawa and Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk.
Nov. 1, 2013	Showadori extended through Crystal Bridge.
Mar.25, 2014	Enactment of basic ordinance for Asahikawa City development plans.
Apr. 1, 2015	Opening of the Tobu Regional Development Center.
Apr. 30, 2015	Opening of the Suehiro Community Activity Center (Atsuma~ru).
May 3, 2015	Asahikawa and Minami-satsuma in Kagoshima Prefecture become Sister Cities.
