


Ways to Exhange

Easy Hokkaido-Ben for You

Did you know Hokkaido has a dialect? Hokkaido has been historically settled by Japanese from all over Honshu resulting to the local language to be mixed and similar to standard language. However, there are some words and expressions that slightly differ from the main dialect. Check them out below!

なげる(nageru) = To throw away; dispose

Standard Japanese: 捨(す) てる

Example: 帰(かえ)る前(まえ)にゴミを**なげておいてね**。

Before going home, please throw away your trash.



しばれる(shibareru) = to be freezing cold

Standard Japanese: 寒(さむ)くて凍(い)てつくこと

Example: こんな**しばれた**日(ひ)に半(はん)そで着(き)てたら風邪(かぜ)ひくよ!

if you wear short sleeves on a **freezing cold** day, you'll catch a cold!



なした(nashita) = What's up? What's the matter?

Standard Japanese: どうしたの?

Example: なした? さっき泣(な)いていた? **What's the matter**? Were you crying earlier?



わや(waya) = very; really; disorderly

Standard Japanese: めっちゃくちゃ

Example: 昨日(きのう)雪(ゆき)降(ふ)って道路(どうろ)が**わや**だったから遅刻(ちこく)したわ! I was late because the snow from yesterday made the roads a **mess!**

だべ・ベ(dabe/be) =

(Ending marker for affirmation; confirmation; to say your thoughts outloud)

Standard Japanese: だろう・でしょう

Example: 今夜(こんや)何(なに)を食(た)べればいいべ。

I wonder what I should eat tonight.

**No direct English translation. Meaning changes based on context.
